## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

A few years ago I was meeting with an old school friend of mine who has since become a pastor in the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod (LCMS). After some fairly “traditional” calls here in the US, he has since gone on to Uganda as a missionary – doing evangelism, teaching in schools, doing the Lord’s work in some very impoverished areas.

We had a conversation about how missionaries get assigned to different areas. Some people, he said are open to going pretty much wherever. They have a desire to serve, a sense of call, and the specific place is not as important.

Others, he said, have a very specific people in mind. And he used an interesting phrase that has since stuck with me. He said some people “feel a burden” for a particular group or nation. He’s not the first, or the last, person I’ve heard say that, but, when he did, it started me thinking about how we think about mission and outreach and evangelism and all these things we talk so much about as churches.

### Who do we feel a burden for?

With so much poverty, addiction, loneliness and problems here in our own back yard, you would think that we all feel a burden for someone – that we all have someone or ones whose pains touch our heart,

whose plight we legitimately feel for, whose suffering viscerally bothers us. And I've heard it described that once you feel a burden for someone, it's almost like it possesses you, takes over your life and you just can't feel comfortable until you've done something about it. It's almost like it takes over you, like an itch you have to scratch, but it won't quite go away.

### **Who do I feel a burden for?**

My mind, of late, has been busy with thoughts about visioning and strategic planning at Lord of Grace. We did our initial survey, using raw data gathered from a questionnaire and crunching it to show patterns about our church, and how we see ourselves. This next phase will be a more in-depth follow-up on that, with small group meetings in homes to get the kind of feedback and dialogue you can't get with an online survey. As before, we need everyone to participate to make our feedback as accurate as possible. You can sign up for a small group gathering in the narthex, or by contacting Lynda Reeves.

Once done, we'll compile the results and do another informational forum for everyone to see. Then, we move on to the next major part of the plan – to get feedback from the community. Like the internal surveys, this will include some data-gathering, as well as interviews and personal feedback. Why? To get a sense of who's around us, who doesn't know the Gospel and whose in need, and how. Often, the real needs of our communities go unnoticed because we may be too busy with our own lives, or in our own social networks, or we may just not bother to run around and ask who's out there. Once we gather that information, we'll get a sense of the gaps in our community, and start to see patterns of where we have the gifts and the strengths to address some of these things. Or, to use my friend's phrase, where we feel a burden.

It's yet another of Jesus' paradoxes, that the way to growth is to go out and feel others' pain, until you can't stand it anymore, and you just have to do something about it. But, this is

his ministry, and how, I believe God really works. He blesses us with burdens, as people with hearts of compassion and love – burdens that can't be met sitting on the couch – burdens that won't go away by ignoring or putting them aside.

Now, in my experience, this can be incredibly exciting, and incredibly dangerous, as God may bless us with a burden we didn't see coming, that's outside of any comfortable circle we've ever been in, that makes us rethink our whole self-perception and plan. But, I also have seen lives changed, the Gospel proclaimed, and powerful things happen when we seek out to be burdened. Remember, discipleship is about following God's plan, where God needs us, where God wants us to go – and that's not always to a place of comfort, but to a burden. May God bless us in the coming months with burdens.

## **PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE**

The outreach team met in September to review the past years outreach events and plan for the year to come. In the past year the congregation helped out with collections of food, shoes, and school supplies to help those in need in our community. Members of the congregation participated with Habitat for Humanity to build housing for those who without Habitat's help might never know the pleasure of owning their own home. Money gathered during the spring rummage sale was sent to Habitat for Humanity – Haiti to support rebuilding homes there and to the Navajo mission in northern Arizona. We also adopted 5 families through Interfaith Community Services and provided Christmas gifts and welcomed these families with a holiday luncheon. These are just few of the worthwhile projects that the church was involved with. As you can see most of these projects helped those within our own community.

The Bible challenges us to care for our community. In his letter to the Galatian Christians, the apostle Paul wrote, "Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers" (6:10). This instruction has sometimes been reduced to the proverb "Charity begins at home." Our lives are rooted in community because that is how God planned it. We are expected to do many things as Christians, but one of the most important dimensions of Christian living is to make a difference in one's neighborhood. Jesus lived his life on earth practicing this principle. He not only served the community he lived or traveled in, but often served those whom society had shunned. Our church mission statement is "Making Christ Known." What better way to do this than serving those in our community who need assistance? Through outreach we can care for those outside the faith, develop healthy relationships that make it easy to invite outsiders into our faith community, and help these new believers grow in their faith.

I challenge you all to get involved with outreach. Opportunities will be abundant in the coming months. Here are a few. The Men's group will be participating in the Hospitality Project which reaches out to homeless men and provides them a safe, warm place to sleep and food. We will be collecting shoe boxes for Operation Christmas Child, providing food baskets at Thanksgiving, and adopting families at Christmas time. I encourage you seek out these opportunities to serve the community. Look in the Newsletter, the church activity table in the fellowship hall or talk to a member of the Outreach team for more information on upcoming opportunities.

## **CONFIRMATION**

## **PROJECT HOSPITALITY**

Our church council has given our church the opportunity to participate in the Project Hospitality Shelter Program. The Tucson Interfaith Coalition for the Homeless, in partnership with the Salvation Army and approximately 30 local churches, coordinates Project Hospitality.

Project Hospitality provides food, shelter, and safety to the homeless during the time period of November 28<sup>th</sup> thru February 28<sup>th</sup>. Winter is a very difficult time for the homeless as Tucson

can experience overnight temperatures in the 20's and 30's.

Lord of Grace would offer overnight shelter for four homeless men for three nights, Monday December 6<sup>th</sup>, Thursday January 6<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday February 9<sup>th</sup>. The men are served an evening meal, breakfast and given a sack lunch as they leave in the morning. Each evening at 5:30 PM the men are picked up at the Salvation Army Hospitality House and returned the next morning leaving the church at 7:00 am. The shelter program will be held in the church fellowship room. Lord of Grace will provide the cooks and two male overnight coordinators. The Salvation Army provides cots and blankets for the men to use.
